10. Newton's Second Task Order – Water Rights

City Manager, Steven Hasson

City Manager Hasson said that the City has done two things to protect water rights. One is that when the Water and Sewer District was transferred into the City they contracted with Newton's to preserve and protect the water rights in the transfer process. He said the other thing they have done is worked with the State of Oregon Water Resources Department to make sure the water rights were continued from the transfer.

11. City Hall Street Frontage Improvements – General Discussion

City Manager Hasson stated that the City applied for and received monies from ODOT (Oregon Department of Transportation) to enhance the frontage of City Hall. He said it will set the stage for how we want our corridor to look.

12. <u>Snow Plowing Strategy - General Discussion</u>

City Manager, Steven Hasson

City Manager Hasson said he has received a number of complaints about snow plowing. He said there was an issue with a lot of people that are parking their vehicles in the swale area where snow should be stored once removed from roads. City Manager Hasson said that in the codes the property owner is responsible for clearing their sidewalks of snow. He said there is a lot of non-compliance. Councilor Agan said that at the corner of Finley Butte and Huntington the snow plowers pile up the snow on that corner making it difficult to see the traffic to make a turn there. City Manager Hasson said that the Code Enforcement Officer, to be hired by the City, will stay busy with these types of complaints. Mayor Mulenex mentioned that there will be a transition time where they will receive comments from the public.

City Recorder Lori Martin stated that they might need to modify the Personnel Services within the budget which would require a budget amendment. She said this amendment sould allocate some of the money under Public Works to Personnel Services so the City could move some of the funds from Public Works up to the General Fund. Ms. Martin said that the City revenue is on target for the year as well as Water and Sewer. She also said that the Water and Sewer audit has been completed. She said the City audit is in its final stage. Ms. Martin said they will retain the current auditor for one more year. City Manager Hasson said that he and Ms. Martin continue to modify the fund summary to make it more understandable. He stated that they have allocated Personnel Services into two different funds and if they were combined the City would be right on tract but this problem has occurred because the funds have been split out. City Manager Hasson said they are really not over in the Personnel Services expenditure it is just the way the funds have been allocated.

Page 6 of 8 Council Mtg City Manager Hasson discussed the letter he had drafted to the Council. He said there is a real need for a traffic light at 1st and Highway 97. City Manager Hasson said that ODOT (Oregon Dept of Transportation) has been trying to fill the funding gap but they have advised City Manager Hasson that it could be some time before they have the funds to move forward. He said ODOT also told him they have another fund they may be able to access if there are matching funds. City Manager Hasson said that the matching funds may be able to come from LIGI monies that were left after LIGI was terminated, as long as the County was agreeable to it. Commissioner Debone said he was in favor of it.
