6. <u>ORDINANCE No. 2014-04 An Ordinance of the City of La Pine Declaring a Moratorium on Medical Marijuana Facilities; and Declaring an Emergency.</u>

## a) Open Public Hearing

Mayor Mulenex opened the Public Hearing.

## b) Staff Report

Attorney Green stated that the ordinance will prohibit the dispensary of marijuana in the City of La Pine for a period of one year through May 1, 2015. He said that there are penalties and enforcement mechanisms contained in the ordinance. He said the Oregon Health Administration would be notified if the ordinance is passed by the City of La Pine.

#### c) Public Comments

Tom Bradler, area resident, stated that he had a problem with the "declaring an emergency" part of the Ordinance. He said after speaking with the Mayor he did understand why that was done but thought it was too bad. Lori Henry, area resident, stated that she belongs to a group that supports keeping drugs out of the hands of young people. She said that studies show that dispensaries can adversely affect the availability of drugs for young people. Doug Ward, Planning Commissioner, stated that the City needs a year to establish the rules and regulations for dispensaries. He said he would urge the City to pass the Ordinance.

# e) Council Deliberations

Councilor Martinez stated it is in the City's best interest to pass the Ordinance to protect both the young people and the seniors. He said a year of caution would serve the City and citizens well as there are too many unknowns at this point in time.

A motion was made by Councilor Ward and seconded by Councilor Jones to approve Ordinance 2014-04 a Moratorium on Medical Marijuana Facilities and Declaring an Emergency.

Attorney Green stated he would have the water sale contract to the City Manager by next week and it will be on the May 14<sup>th</sup> Council meeting agenda for approval. In response to a question from Councilor Agan, City Attorney Green stated that there does seem to be movement to legalize marijuana. He said he believes that legislation may be made in November to legalize marijuana. City Attorney Green said after the expiration of the moratorium some cities may continue to prohibit marijuana dispensaries under the Home Rule. He said the cities could be challenged in court, however. Mayor Mulenex mentioned that the average user of medical marijuana is a 24 year old male and it is prescribed for post-traumatic stress disorder. He also said that there are only four doctors in the State of Oregon that prescribe most of the medical marijuana prescriptions. City Attorney Green stated that another issue is that the federal government still considers marijuana an illegal drug. He said he will work with the City on the rules and regulations for medical marijuana dispensaries.
