The La Pine Parks and Recreation Department (LPRD) has submitted a Community Grant Application requesting funding for their annual Music in the Pines summer concert series. The City Council will then discuss the various proposals and based on budgetary restrictions fund the projects it deems most advantageous to the city as a whole. The City of La Pine adopts it's new budget in June of each year and can only award as much as budgeted, which can vary, from year to year.

The La Pine Lions Club Parks is requesting a Community Grant in the amount of \$750.00 as seed money in its efforts to retrofit its concession trailer with updated Fire Suppression System. Under the Oregon Mechanical Specialty Code, any operator of a food concession trailer that has an indoor cooking device is required to make this installation by January 1, 2025. The Lions Club intends to use this initial investment as a starting point in their fundraising efforts to meet the total cost of the project, which is estimated between \$6,000 and \$10,000.

The basis for this specific request is the need to have an ongoing and operational concession trailer which helps the Lions meet their organizational goals of community support. Attached to this application is the budget sheet and an expanded narrative that further explains the basis for request from the Lions Club of La Pine.

La Pine Lions Club Foundation is a 501c3 organization chartered in 2004. We have been a steady influence for good in this community for many years and plan to continue to do so into the future. We help individuals and groups in ways both known and unknown to the public. We currently have 33 members with more waiting to join. We work hard to help with sight and hearing, diabetes, emergency response, scholarships and so much more. At least 90% of our fund raising projects involve the Food Concession Trailer. The community recognizes the large yellow Lion on the side of our food trailer at many community events. Projects such as our Golf Tournament, Cascade Lake Relay, Oktoberfest, Music in the Pines, La Pine Rodeo and more depend almost entirely on food sales from the trailer.

Oregon Fire Code Requirements for all food vendors will require vendors to install a Fire Suppression System in accordance with the Oregon Mechanical Specialty Code by **Jan 1**, **2025**.

- Any cooking device that is indoors, in a trailer, or in a combustible booth and creates grease-laden vapors shall be provided by a vendor with an approved hood and extinguishing system that has been serviced in the last 6 months.
- All hood ventilating systems are required to be installed in accordance with the Oregon Mechanical Specialty Code and be cleaned prior to start of the event and as often as needed to prevent the build-up of grease during the event.

It is estimated that the cost of a system will be \$6000 +/- plus shipping and installation (At this time). We will not be able to meet our commitments to help others in this community if we cannot upgrade our concession trailer. We plan to start fundraising this summer and for the next three years in order to meet the requirements. However, in addition to funding our other commitments, this will be a stretch for us.

We are asking for seed money to begin our fundraising. We hope the lion's trailer will continue to be seen around central and south central Oregon as a sign of good food, pleasant people and community service. We are proud to be a part of the La Pine Community.

The La Pine Lions Club Parks is requesting a Tourism Grant in the amount of \$750 for advertising expenses for their upcoming Oktoberfest celebration. They endeavor to use the funding to expand their reach for the event to the SunRiver, Bend, Madras, Redmond, Christmas Valley/Fort Rock, Klamath Falls, Portland, Medford, and Prineville areas.

The Lions Oktoberfest is intended to garner a minimum of 500 visitors to the event which the club hopes will expand into overnight stays, and tourism spending in the La Pine area. They also intend for this event to help support their ongoing mission of sight and hearing assistance programs that currently are made available to the greater La Pine community, including northern Klamath County.

The club has attached and expanded narrative, budget sheet, permit license cost sheet, sight and hearing support fact sheet, and anticipated advertisement schedule for Council consideration.

La Pine Lions Club Foundation is a non-profit 501c3 organization chartered in 2004. We have been a part of the La Pine Community for many years and plan to be a part of it for many more. Our membership dropped during covid as did our fund raising projects but membership is steadily growing with 33 members as of this date and others waiting to apply. Our long term average has been around 30 so we are successfully recovering from the shut downs. The funds in our Foundation average \$10,000 plus or minus. Many projects are planned for this summer and fall to raise funds for community assistance in sight and hearing, diabetes, emergency response and much more.

Funds we generate from service projects go to our activity account and that pays for sight and hearing assistance in our community and Northern Klamath County. Despite the shut-downs we were able to fund 23 eye assistance applicants and 3 hearing applicants in 2021. This year to date our club has assisted 5 persons for eye care assistance and 1 for hearing. Also in 2021 (see attached) Oregon MD 36 (Oregon and N. Cal) was top in the nation for school eye testing. To date in 2022 Lions Clubs in Deschutes County have tested between 180,000 and 200,000 elementary students with a referral rate of 10%. This 10% is a large number of young students who are in need of visual assistance and further testing. Without intervention they risk school academic failure, with all its associated risks.

(This just in, the final numbers for eye testing in:

La Pine Elementary, 292 students tested, Rosland Elementary, 172 students tested, and Three Rivers Elementary, 369 students tested for a total of 832 students. La Pine Elementary referral rate was 15%. Rosland Elementary had a 13% referral rate, and Three Rivers a 16% referral rate.)

As you can see, the school vision program is vital for south Deschutes County and a real need exists, not only among the youngsters but the adult and senior population as well.

Another project we support in the La Pine Community is High School Graduate scholarships. Last year we awarded 5 students with college funds, this year we will support 5 as well. La Pine has a large number of well qualified student applicants with unfortunate home and financial situations and we are determined to continue to support these students. We also offer a yearly scholarship to a senior or child through the Park and Recreation Programs. We installed a "Lion" fountain in Heritage Park.


Many of our projects draw visitors from other areas to our community. It is our hope that visitors will be drawn to our community to attend and enjoy our 2022 Oktoberfest September 10 at Park and Rec. We plan to advertise outside of our community as well as within. It is our hope that at least 500 people attend Oktoberfest, spend a night or two at one of our many campgrounds, RV parks, BnBs, Motels, Cabins and spend their money in our local businesses. We hope the transient tax will be a benefit and more people will see what a wonderful place La Pine and Central Oregon really are; our beautiful land and the honest friendly people who reside here. If we are chosen to receive a grant it will be used to advertise and promote tourism in La Pine. We are proud to call this place our home.
