- <u>Letter of Support for the Newberry Thermal Project</u>

David Stowe, Public Relations Representative, spoke about the project. He said the letter is for the lab. Mr. Stower said it's to have a national geo-thermal research facility sponsored by the Department of Energy and located at the Newberry Thermal Project. He said there are ten national sites competing for the grant. Mr. Stowe stated it will be narrowed down to three sites and then in 2016 the final selection will occur. He said there will be companies coming in from all over the world to do research at the lab. Mr. Stowe said the County Commissioners have given them a letter of support. He said the types of jobs available would be for scientist. Councilor Agan said she fully supported the lab. Mayor Mulenex said it is a great opportunity for La Pine.

7. Funding Request for KITC-FM New Radio Station

Bill Scully, Manager of KITC-FM, stated that he is asking the Council for \$2,000 to put in a new radio station, KNCP. He said the radio station will have three times the coverage that the current radio station has. Mr. Scully said they are in the process of raising \$8,000 for the project. He said the radio station is non-profit. Mr. Scully said all the staff are volunteers. He said they provide a radio broadcast van for a lot of local events. Councilor Martinez said the radio station has been a real asset. Mr. Scully said they have raised about \$2,300 to date. Conrad Parker, Student Councilor, said that it is great to have a radio station that belongs to our area. Mr. Scully said that they broadcast almost every game of the Grizzlies. Mayor Mulenex said that a town needs a radio station. He said the City should find the money to get this off the ground. Interim City Manager Allen stated that a lot of money has already been donated from the City to various organizations and the fund is very low now. He said that the request really did not fall into the funds from the transit room tax for promoting tourism. Mr. Allen said that capital money cannot be moved into materials and services without amending the budget. He suggested maybe taking some money from business development that is in the general fund, and has not yet been allocated. Mr. Allen suggested bringing this request back at the November 12th Council Meeting. Councilor Martinez said he was in favor of tabling it at this time. Councilor Agan said she was also in favor of tabling the request to the meeting on November 12th.

8. Funding Request for Lodgepole Dodgers Snowmobile Club

Rick Vice, President of the La Pine Lodgepole Dodgers, said that the State Convention will be in La Pine this year and that people will be coming from all over the State. He said they are hoping for about 300 people to attend the convention. Mr. Vice said they are trying to promote the Newberry Crater area for snowmobilers. Mayor Mulenex said there are really very few activities in La Pine over the wintertime, to bring people into the area. Rick Allen said that this event is qualified to receive transit room tax monies that are in the budget. The club was requesting \$1,000.00.

10. <u>Discussion on City Tax for Medical Marijuana</u>

Rick Allen stated that it does not appear, at the State level, that there will be any proposed legislation to extend the moratorium on medical marijuana. He said the City will need to come up with rules for medical marijuana dispensaries in La Pine. Mr. Allen said that a public entity cannot place a tax on marijuana after it has been approved by the voters. He said the tax needs to occur prior to the election and it would be a tax on gross sales. Mr. Allen showed a list of Oregon cities that had approved the tax on marijuana. He said the tax could be approved at an October 22, 2014 Council Meeting. Mr. Allen said most of the cities were taxing 5% for medical marijuana and 10% for recreational marijuana. He said

there would be penalties and interest if the tax is not paid. Mr. Allen said that Deschutes County had no plans to tax marijuana. Conrad Parker stated that even if recreational marijuana does not pass this time, it will probably eventually be approved and therefore should be taxed. Councilor Martinez said he looks at it like a franchise tax, if they want to do business in the City they need to be taxed. Councilor Agan also agreed that the City needs to move forward with the tax. Mr. Allen said that the money taxed would be used for enforcement, etc. Mayor Mulenex said he liked 5% tax for medical marijuana and 10% tax for recreational. Councilor Agan said she liked 12% recreational tax and 5% medical tax. Mayor Mulenex said he could support those rates. Councilor Martinez said he agreed with taxing the medical marijuana.

Public Comment

Glen Costello, area resident, stated that a lot of the people who have medical marijuana prescriptions are low income due to disability, etc. He said that marijuana is the number one cure for brain cancer. Mr. Costello said that some cities are considering no tax for medical marijuana. He said that are a lot of overhead costs for making medical marijuana.

Interim City Manager Allen stated he would bring back the Ordinance on the marijuana tax to the Oct. 22nd Council Meeting.

Ann Gawith, Director of the Chamber of Commerce, suggested that maybe some of the monies set aside for Frontier Days could be used for the new radio station, instead. She said they felt very strongly that the radio station was important for the City.

13. Staff Comments

Mr. Allen cautioned the Council to be careful about using money funded for one thing for another thing. He also discussed the new finance person, Brenda Bartlett, who has been hired and is starting work at City Hall. Mr. Allen said that the new City Planner, Bill Adams, is also starting to work at City Hall. He said next week will be the first site plan review by the City.

Councilor Agan stated that she was really pleased with the sidewalk project at Bi-Mart. Mr. Allen also talked about a recently completed building in the Industrial Park that did not have landscape as planned. He said the City is having the County follow up with the builder/owner on the landscape deficiency. Mr. Allen also showed and discussed photos of various residences that had code violations

Councilor Martinez stated that he attended the new Deschutes County Jail opening. Mr. Allen said that the Sheriff will be meeting with the residents from Huntington Meadows in the near future. Councilor Martinez said that the public is invited to the ceremony for Bob Shotwell Day at the High School on November 10th.
