Presentation was made by members of Deschutes County Health Services regarding licensing of tobacco retailers. Council discussion and questions followed. DCHS will provide council with the OHA definition of a tobacco product. At that time the topic will be added to a work session.

 <u>Glenwood Acres Homeowners Association Water Board – Discussion</u> Paul Miller, president of Glenwood Acres Homeowners Association (GAHA) spoke in support of the request. Councilor Briese recused herself from council discussion as she is a resident of the neighborhood.

Obrist provided an overview of the staff report. Council discussion and questions followed. Options discussed included contracting out a water operator to assist with the current water system until the City's services are brought to the neighborhood, beginning in 2021. It was determined the City and GAHA do additional research on costs and bring the information back to council.



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

Thank you for your consideration of our enclosed Community Funding Request Application. The La Pine Community Kitchen meets the needs of the community by providing food and clothing in a welcoming safe environment.

This is a community made up of three ongoing programs. The Kitchen offers hot, nutritious meals five days a week. We operate The Produce Stand two days a week distributing donated fresh produce, bread, dairy and some groceries. The Closet is open two days a week as well, offering lightly used clothing, coats, hats, gloves, hygiene products, bedding, tents, sleeping bags and tarps.

In 2018, The Kitchen served 15,561 meals, while The Produce Stand provided 265,532 lbs. of goods and The Closet provided 26,588 comfort articles to our community. We received over 11,785 volunteer hours.

We apply for grants throughout the year, however most of those funds are approved for the purchase of food. The purpose of the enclosed funding request is to support our ongoing hot meal program by providing the maintenance and cleaning supplies for our dishwasher which costs approximately \$3675 annually. In addition to the kitchen supplies, we would also use the approved funds for maintenance costs associated with the hot meal program's freezers, refrigerators and stove repairs for six months which is approximately \$1000.

The City desires to improve the Landscaping/Streetscape of City Hall along the west side of our entrance and parking lot.

Background

The City has an increase in vehicular and pedestrian traffic with City Hall and some improvements are suggested. These suggestions include constructing landscaping to improve aesthetics and delineate the parking areas to inhibit driving off the designated paved areas. Patrons that use City Hall for their services will often park on the edge or off parking areas into the soft-scape areas. This causes unnecessary damage to the asphalt edges and erosion to these areas. The landscaping will include elements similar to our streetscapes in town, keeping the same theme with a more dry-scape approach. The use of decorative boulders will delineate the parking lot areas, and bunch grass Blue Fescue, purple Salvia, and white Snow in Summer will accent these areas.
