# 7. <u>Discussion on Building Permit Report from Deschutes County</u>

City Manager Cory Misley said every land use application is reviewed by City Planner Tammy Wisco. After that the requester needs to apply for a building permit, and any other permits, with Deschutes County. There is a fee that everyone has to pay called advanced planning. Inside the City limits Deschutes County did not perform any planning services. Instead, the City performed the planning functions. The City is now receiving a small percentage of the fees collected by Deschutes County. Mr. Misley did discuss that the City does not currently have a transportation system fee but probably will have it sometime in the future. He also said that the SDC (System Development Charges) will usually go up because the utility system is constantly growing. It was also discussed that the cost of water and sewer with the City is very low when compared to other entities. Mr. Misley said that residential homes do not require a site plan with the City, however the City does review the plan from Deschutes County. He said he has been getting the building permit report on a weekly basis, from Deschutes County.

# 8. <u>Discussion on Draft Recreational Marijuana Time, Place, and Manner (TPM) Regulations</u>

Mr. Misley said that the recreational marijuana, which is on the ballot for the City's registered voters to vote on, will require TPM regulations. He said that a retailer must not be located within 1,000 feet of a school. Other restrictions include 750 feet of the library and 500 feet from a child care facility. They also cannot be within 1,000 feet of another dispensary. Mr. Misley said the current medical dispensaries will want to sell recreational marijuana if it is voted into the City. He also the dispensaries would have to meet certain requirements. Mr. Misley said the State will check with the City when processing an application. Regarding the growing of marijuana, the zoning code was amended to allow these types of businesses with certain requirements. It was also discussed that a marijuana growing facility could be closer to a dispensary than 1,000 feet. It was discussed that if an infraction on a permit happens, there would be a penalty to be paid and the City Manager would be the person to enforce a permit infraction. There was also a discussion on operating hours and open days for the recreational marijuana dispensaries. Mr. Misley recommended having the TPM regulations for recreational sales be the same as the TPM for medical dispensaries. He also discussed the security that exists at both of the medical marijuana dispensaries per State requirements. Mr. Misley said he will make site visits to the dispensaries. In addition, if the recreational marijuana dispensaries are taxed, they will submit a tax reporting form to the City on a monthly basis along with their payment of the tax.

### 9. Update on Planning Applications and Projects

Chair Fleming asked about the application to partition an existing 2.2 acres into three parcels. Ms. Wisco stated that there were several small lots near the area requesting to be partitioned. The property is also near the Industrial zone. Mr. Misley said there is room for discretion by the City. There was also a discussion on the smaller lots having problems with snow removal in the winter. It was discussed, that new properties that attach to the water and sewer system sometimes want to subdivide their lot and sell the other half. Mr. Misley said the plan, by Newberry Habitat, to build condominiums was not now going to happen. He also said a developer is now looking into building apartments on County land. There was also a discussion on the proposed transit site off Highway 97 and the new medical clinic that is going in on Huntington Road.
