## 7. Interview of Candidates for Planning Commission Position

Don Greiner was interviewed for the open position on the Planning Commission. He gave a brief background on his relationship with La Pine. Mr. Greiner is a former City Councilor. Chair Ward stated that he has known Mr. Greiner and he is an honorable man.

Rolando Alonzo was interviewed for one of the two openings on the Planning Commission. He said he constructed the La Pine sign and also has been involved in various community projects. Mr. Alonzo said that he felt he could bring value to the Commission as a result of his work for Habitat for Humanity.

Chair Ward stated that these two nominations will be put before the City Council for final approval.

#### 8. Nuisance Abatement Ordinance

Motion passed unanimously.

Deborah McMahon, City Planner, said she would be reviewing the Nuisance Abatement Ordinance that City Attorney Jeremy Green had developed. She said the program will be broader than before and easier to enforce. Ms. McMahon said that she was informed that the finalized version of the Ordinance could be presented to the City Council at their February meeting. She said she only saw one change and that was regarding violations. Ms. McMahon said she wanted the fees charged to be a real deterrent to violations. She said the fees would be between \$250 and \$500 per day. Ms. McMahon stated that prior to attaching the fines the City would be working with the property owner to resolve the violation. Interim City Manager Allen said that most of the complaints that are received at City Hall are for nuisance issues. He also said that they will be educating the public about the Ordinance, some type of an Open House after the Ordinance has been approved by the Council. Deborah McMahon said that they are recommending that the process for a violation start with the City Manager and end with the City Council so it can stay local.

## 9. <u>Transition Update on City Assuming Planning Duties</u>

Deborah McMahon stated that the City is taking over planning duties from Deschutes County on January 1, 2014. She said that the Planning Commission is responsible for managing the Ordinances and also land use permits that require review and approval. Ms. McMahon said not every planning related request will go through the Planning Commission due to expediency. Staff will be available to assist the public. Ms. McMahon said that a building permit will be signed off by the City and then it will go to the County. She said that the Planning Commission also serves in a legislative capacity when new text or improvements to Ordinances are required. Ms. McMahon stated that staff will prepare a report and the Planning Commission will make a decision based on the Ordinance. She said that exemptions will be documented and brought to the Planning Commission. Ms. McMahon said eventually the fees charged for tasks will support staff's time, etc. Mr. Allen said the City needs to educate the public as to their need to get a permit for something. He also mentioned that the Business License will become effective July 1, 2014. There was also a discussion on the Code of Ordinances that codifies all the Ordinances passed in the City of La Pine.

#### 10. <u>Designation of Terms for Planning Commissioners</u>
